

UoNA Student Code of Conduct

Students are expected to behave and treat others on campus as professional scholars. Students attend the University from all parts of the world and from many varied backgrounds. This diversity provides a rich environment for the free exploration and expression of ideas, and students are expected to participate fully and to uphold the right of others to do the same.

Students are expected to abide by all public laws and generally accepted professional standards, to comply with all regulations and policies of the University, and to conduct themselves professionally when interacting with fellow students, faculty, and staff. The University reserves the right to place a student on disciplinary warning, probation, suspension, or dismissal, who engages in unsatisfactory conduct such as dishonesty; failure to adhere to rules and regulations; destruction or theft of property; participation in activity that impinges on the rights of others; or possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs at any time on these premises.

Violations of conduct should be reported to the Director of Student Services. The Director, who



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Academic Integrity.

Includes plagiarism & all elements as defined in the policy. Faculty are required to submit a record of all violations and penalties to the VP of Academic Affairs.

Collegial Responsibility.

Includes (a) Timely submission of assignments and (b) Participation in scheduled class sessions or activities

Consequences

1st violation of policy - The instructor will choose to allow the student to submit a signed (to be used as a consulting opportunity) assignment to the VP of Academic Affairs. The student will be given a reduced grade of 20% less than the original grade for the assignment. The student will be required to attend a class session with the instructor. 2nd violation of policy - The instructor will choose to allow the student to submit an assignment with a reduced grade of 20% less than the original grade for the assignment. The student will be required to attend a class session with the instructor. 3rd violation of policy - The instructor will choose to allow the student to submit an assignment with a reduced grade of 30% less than the original grade for the assignment. The student will be required to attend a class session with the instructor. Further or continued incidents of violations of policy may result in dismissal from the university.

Appeals Process.

Students may submit a request for an appeal of a grade if they have extenuating circumstances. The request must be submitted within two weeks of the occurrence. The request will be reviewed by a committee of faculty members, one of whom will be a representative of the student body. The committee will make a recommendation to the VP of Academic Affairs. If the appeal is successful, the student's grade will be adjusted. If the appeal is unsuccessful, the student's grade will remain the same. The student may appeal the committee's decision to the VP of Academic Affairs. The student must submit a written appeal within two weeks of the committee's decision. The VP of Academic Affairs will make a final decision on the appeal. If the appeal is successful, the student's grade will be adjusted. If the appeal is unsuccessful, the student's grade will remain the same.
